

MEETING OF FEBRUARY 11, 1963

COUNCIL CHAMBER

979th MEETING

The nine hundred seventy-ninth regular meeting of the Council of the City of Milwaukie, Oregon, was held in the Council Chamber of the City Hall in Milwaukie, Oregon, on the eleventh day of February, 1963, commencing at the hour of 7:30 o'clock P.M. Pacific Standard Time.

The meeting was duly called to order by Mayor Joseph M. Bernard, Chairman of the Council.

The roll was taken by Clerk Ellen Martin. Those present were: Mayor Joseph M. Bernard, Jr.; Councilmen Theron E. Sedgwick, Charles Renard, Robert E. Richmond and Walter J. Freeman, being all of the members of the Council. Also present at the meeting were City Manager Leonard B. Mullan, Assistant Manager Max Thompson, City Attorney John O. Sheldahl and Clerk Ellen Martin.

The invocation, opening the meeting, was given by Reverend Roy Irwin, Pastor of the Ardenwald Baptist Church.

Mr. Westling, from the League of Oregon Cities, Bureau of Municipal Research, explained to the Council the Urban Planning Assistance Program in Oregon, Future Planning of Streets, Capital Programming, etc.

The hour having arrived for the hearing on the annexation of property described in Ordinance No. 956, the Mayor opened the hearing and called for any objections to the annexation. There was no person present who made objection and no written objection had been received. The Mayor declared the hearing closed. Ordinance Number 959 was taken up and read for its first reading. It was moved by Sedgwick and seconded by Renard that Ordinance Number 959 be passed to its second reading and that it be read at this time by title only. Motion carried and so ordered.

Ordinance Number 959 AN ORDINANCE annexing certain territory, contiguous to the present boundaries of the City of Milwaukie, Clackamas County, Oregon, and fixing the effective date of such annexation, was again taken up and read by title only and put on its passage with the following result being had: Ayes: Sedgwick, Richmond, Freeman, Renard and Bernard. Nays: None. Ordinance Number 959 passed the Council and was so declared by the Mayor.

The Mayor opened the hearing on the withdrawal of recently annexed territories from the Milwaukie Rural Fire Protection District, and called for objection to the same. There was no person present who made objection and no written objection had been received. The Mayor declared the hearing closed.

Ordinance Number 960 was taken up and read for its first reading. It was moved by Sedgwick and seconded by Renard that Ordinance Number 960 be passed to its second reading and that it be read by title only at this time. Motion carried and so ordered.

Ordinance Number 960 AN ORDINANCE withdrawing from the Milwaukie Rural Fire Protection District, Clackamas County, Oregon, those parts of said District heretofore annexed to and incorporated within the City boundaries of the City of Milwaukie, Oregon; was again taken up and read by title only for its second reading and put on its passage with the following result being had: Ayes: Sedgwick, Richmond, Freeman, Renard and Bernard. Nays: None. Ordinance Number 960 passed the Council and was so declared by the Mayor.

The Mayor opened the hearing on the withdrawal of recently annexed territory from the Clackamas Water District and called for objection to the same. There was no person present who made objection and no written objection had been received. The Mayor declared the hearing closed.

The Mayor opened the hearing on the withdrawal of recently annexed territory from the Wichita Zoning District and called for objection to the same. There was no person present who made objection and no written objection had been received. The Mayor declared the hearing closed.

Mr. Ed. Darnell appeared before the Council and requested that something be done about the improvement of Adams Street, east of 21st Street. The Council authorized the City Manager to make a survey of what could be done and the estimated cost of the same.

Ordinance Number 961 was taken up and read for its first reading. It was moved by Sedgwick and seconded by Freeman that Ordinance Number 961 be passed to its second reading and that it be read at this time by title only. Motion carried and so ordered.

Ordinance Number 961 AN ORDINANCE relating to Waste Receptacles and/or Containers; providing for a penalty for the violation thereof; and declaring an emergency; was again taken up and read for its second reading by title only and put on its passage with the following result being had: Ayes: Sedgwick, Freeman, Richmond, Renard and Bernard. Nays: None. Ordinance Number 961 passed the Council and was so declared by the Mayor.

Ordinance Number 962 was taken up and read for its first reading. It was moved by Sedgwick and seconded by Richmond that Ordinance Number 962 be passed to its second reading and that it be read at this time by title only. Motion carried and so ordered.

Ordinance Number 962 AN ORDINANCE relating to the Fire Alarm Systems and the turning in of false fire alarms; providing a penalty for the violation thereof, and declaring any emergency; was again taken up and read for its second reading by title only, and put on its passage with the following result being had: Ayes: Sedgwick, Richmond, Freeman, Renard and Bernard. Nays: None. Ordinance Number 962 passed the Council and was so declared by the Mayor.

Ordinance Number 963 was taken up and read for its first reading. It was moved by Sedgwick and seconded by Richmond that Ordinance Number 963 be passed to its second reading and that it be read at this time by title only. Motion carried and so ordered.

Ordinance Number 963 AN ORDINANCE granting a revocable permit to Pacific Northwest Bell Telephone Company to install, maintain and operate public telephone booths at various locations on City property and City streets, and declaring an emergency; was again taken up and read for its second reading by title only and put on its passage with the following result being had: Ayes: Sedgwick, Freeman, Richmond, Renard and Bernard. Nays: None. Ordinance Number 963 passed the Council and was so declared by the Mayor.

Ordinance Number 964 was taken up and read for its first reading. It was moved by Sedgwick and seconded by Freeman that Ordinance Number 964 be passed to its second reading and that it be read at this time by title only. Motion carried and so ordered.

Ordinance Number 964 AN ORDINANCE withdrawing from the Clackamas Water District, Clackamas County, Oregon, those parts of said District heretofore annexed to and incorporated within the boundaries of the City of Milwaukie, Oregon; was again taken up and read by title only for its second reading and put on its passage with the following result being had; Ayes: Sedgwick, Richmond, Freeman, Renard and Bernard. Nays: None. Ordinance Number 964 passed the Council and was so declared by the Mayor.

Ordinance Number 965 was taken up and read for its first reading. It was moved by Sedgwick and seconded by Richmond that Ordinance Number 965 be passed to its second reading and that it be read at this time by title only. Motion carried and so ordered.

Ordinance Number 965 AN ORDINANCE withdrawing from the Wichita Zoning District, Clackamas County, Oregon, those parts of said District heretofore annexed to and incorporated within the City boundaries of the City of Milwaukie, Oregon; was again taken up and read by title only, for its second reading and put on its passage with the following result being had; Ayes: Sedgwick, Richmond, Freeman, Renard and Bernard. Nays: None. Ordinance Number 965 passed the Council and was so declared by the Mayor.

A letter, from the Milwaukie Planning Commission, in which they recommended zone changes was read. It was moved by Renard and seconded by Freeman that the recommendations of the Planning Commission be adopted. Motion carried and so ordered.

Ordinance Number 966 was taken up and read for its first reading. It was moved by Renard and seconded by Freeman that Ordinance Number 966 be passed to its second reading and that it be read by title only at this time. Motion carried and so ordered.

Ordinance Number 966 AN ORDINANCE providing for the rezoning of certain properties in the City of Milwaukie, Clackamas County, Oregon, from Zone 3-R-1 to Commercial Zone, amending Ordinance Number 481, as amended, and declaring an emergency, was taken up and read by title only for its second reading and put on its passage with the following result being had; Ayes: Sedgwick, Richmond, Freeman, Renard, and Bernard. Nays: None. Ordinance Number 966 passed the Council and was so declared by the Mayor.

Ordinance Number 967 was taken up and read for its first reading. It was moved by Sedgwick and Seconded by Freeman that Ordinance Number 967 be passed to its second reading and that it be read at this time by title only. Motion carried and so ordered.

Ordinance Number 967 AN ORDINANCE providing for the rezoning of certain properties in the City of Milwaukie, Clackamas County, Oregon, from 3-R-1 zone to 3-R-2 SPECIAL Zone amending Ordinance Number 481, as amended, and declaring an emergency, was again taken up and read by title only for its second reading and put on its passage with the following result being had: Ayes: Sedgwick, Freeman, Richmond, Renard, and Bernard. Nays: None. Ordinance Number 967 passed the Council and was so declared by the Mayor.

Resolution Number 6-1963, authorizing and empowering the City of Milwaukie Oregon, to provide for the establishment, construction, equipment and maintenance of a building to be used for a public library and to issue its negotiable general obligation bonds in the principal amount of \$150,000.00 to pay the cost thereof, was then presented and read to the City Council by City Attorney John O. Sheldahl.

It was moved by Councilman Theron E. Sedgwick and seconded by Councilman Robert E. Richmond that Resolution Number 6-1963 be adopted. The motion was put to a vote by the Mayor and Chairman Joseph M. Bernard, Jr., with the following result: Ayes: Joseph M. Bernard, Jr., Theron E. Sedgwick, Charles Renard, Robert E. Richmond, Walter J. Freeman. Nays: None. Joseph M. Bernard, Jr., Mayor and Chairman, then declared that Resolution No. 6-1963, had been adopted by the unanimous vote of all the members of the City Council.

Pursuant to the directives contained in said Resolution, the Mayor and Chairman then ordered that original of Resolution No. 6-1963, be placed on file with the City Recorder at his office in the City Hall in Milwaukie, Oregon, at least fifteen (15) days before March 15, 1963, and that an exact copy of said Resolution No. 6-1963, be inserted in and made a part of the minutes of this regular meeting of the City Council.

An exact copy of Resolution No. 6-1963, is in words and figures as hereinafter in these minutes next set forth.

#### RESOLUTION NUMBER 6-1963

A RESOLUTION SUBMITTING TO THE LEGAL VOTERS OF THE CITY OF MILWAUKIE, OREGON, AN AMENDMENT TO THE CITY CHARTER, AS AMENDED, TO BE KNOWN AS CHAPTER VIII-E, WHICH PROVIDES FOR THE ESTABLISHMENT, CONSTRUCTION, EQUIPMENT AND MAINTENANCE OF A BUILDING TO BE USED FOR A PUBLIC LIBRARY ON PROPERTY NOW OWNED BY SAID CITY WITHIN THE BOUNDARIES OF SAID CITY, WHICH PROVIDES FOR THE PAYMENT THEREOF BY THE ISSUANCE OF NEGOTIABLE GENERAL OBLIGATION BONDS OF THE SAID CITY IN THE AMOUNT OF \$150,000.00 WHICH SHALL BE PAID BY AD VALOREM TAXES ON ALL TAXABLE PROPERTY WITHIN THE CITY OF MILWAUKIE, OREGON, PROVIDING FOR THE BALLOT TITLE UNDER WHICH SAID AMENDMENT SHALL APPEAR, AND CALLING AND PROVIDING FOR A SPECIAL ELECTION AT WHICH SAID CHARTER AMENDMENT IS TO BE SUBMITTED TO THE LEGAL VOTERS OF THE CITY OF MILWAUKIE, OREGON.

WHEREAS, the City of Milwaukie, Oregon, is now served with inadequate public library facilities; and

WHEREAS, the City Council of the City of Milwaukie, Oregon, has caused to be prepared plans, specifications and estimates of the cost of the establishment, construction, equipment and maintenance of a building to be used for public library purposes on land now owned by said City within the boundaries of said City which would provide an adequate public library building and facilities to serve the citizens and residents of the City of Milwaukie, Oregon; and

WHEREAS, the establishment, construction, equipment and maintenance of a building to be used for a public library now contemplated will constitute a benefit to the entire City of Milwaukie and its inhabitants and should be paid for by all of the taxpayers residing within said City; and

WHEREAS, in order to raise the funds required to establish, construct, equip and maintain a building to be used for a public library, it will be necessary that the City issue its negotiable general obligation bonds in the principal amount of \$150,000.00; and

WHEREAS, the City of Milwaukie desires to amend its Charter, as amended, in order that the power to establish, construct, equip and maintain a building to be used for a public library, and in order that the power to issue negotiable general obligation bonds of the City in payment therefore and the right to levy and collect such ad valorem taxes on all of the taxable property within the City of Milwaukie, Oregon, for the payment of principal and interest of said bonds may specifically be provided for,

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF MILWAUKIE, OREGON, that a special election be and the same is hereby called to be held in the City of Milwaukie, Oregon, on the 15th day of March, 1963, between the hours of 8:00 o'clock a.m., and 8:00 o'clock p.m., Pacific Standard Time, at which time there shall be submitted to the legal voters of the City of Milwaukie, Oregon, for adoption or rejection, a proposed amendment to the Charter of the City of Milwaukie, as amended, which Charter was adopted on November 7, 1944, which said proposed amendment is to be a new Chapter, designated as Chapter VIII-E, and the said amendment to be so submitted shall be as follows:

#### CHARTER AMENDMENT

PROPOSED BY THE CITY COUNCIL AND REFERRED TO THE LEGAL VOTERS OF SAID CITY

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE CITY OF MILWAUKIE, OREGON:

That the Charter of the City of Milwaukie, Oregon, adopted by the people of the City of Milwaukie, Oregon, on the 7th day of November, 1944, as amended, be and the same is hereby further amended by adding thereto the following chapter, to be known as Chapter VIII-E:

#### CHAPTER VIII-E

In addition to the other methods provided by the Charter of the City of Milwaukie, Oregon, or the General Laws of the State of Oregon, and not in derogation of any such powers, the City Council of the City of Milwaukie, Oregon, when in its discretion it is deemed advisable, may provide by resolution or resolutions for the establishment, construction, equipment and maintenance of a building to be used for a public library on property now owned by said City within the boundaries of said City, either by contract method or city construction method, or by the combination of both, together with all the appurtenances necessary for the completion and operation of said public library; and to pay the cost thereof, the City Council of the City of Milwaukie is hereby authorized to issue \$150,000.00 in negotiable general obligation bonds of the City of Milwaukie, Oregon, which shall be paid by an ad valorem tax on all taxable property within the corporate limits of the said City of Milwaukie.

The City Council of the City of Milwaukie, Oregon, each year shall provide in the budget for sufficient funds to pay the principal and interest on said negotiable general obligation bonds of the City of Milwaukie, Oregon, which taxes shall be in addition to all other taxes permitted by the Charter, as amended, of the City of Milwaukie, Oregon, and the Constitution and the laws of the State of Oregon.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF MILWAUKIE, OREGON, that it is not practicable to submit the foregoing measure or charter amendment in the form and by ballot title required by subsection (1) of Section 20, of Article V of Ordinance No. 735 of the City of Milwaukie, Oregon, and that, in order to truly and impartially state the purpose and effect of the measure or charter amendment in question, it should be submitted to the legal voters of the City of Milwaukie, Oregon, in the following form and ballot title, to-wit:

CHARTER AMENDMENT PROPOSED BY THE CITY COUNCIL AND REFERRED TO THE LEGAL VOTERS OF THE CITY OF MILWAUKIE, OREGON

PROPOSED AMENDMENT TO THE CITY CHARTER. Shall the Charter of the City of Milwaukie, Oregon, as amended, be further amended by adding thereto a Chapter to be known as Chapter VIII-E, authorizing and empowering the City Council to establish, construct, equip and maintain a building to be used for a public library on property now owned by said City within the boundaries of said City; authorizing and empowering the City Council to issue negotiable general obligation bonds of the City of Milwaukie, Oregon, in the amount of \$150,000.00, which shall be paid by an annual ad valorem tax on all taxable property within the corporate limits of said City that is in addition to all other taxes permitted by the Charter, as amended, of the City of Milwaukie, Oregon, and the laws of the State of Oregon; and authorizing, empowering and directing the City Council to provide each year in the budget of said City for sufficient funds to pay the principal and interest on said negotiable general obligation bonds.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF MILWAUKIE, OREGON, that the election precinct for said special election shall be and constitute all of the territory within the corporate limits of the City of Milwaukie, Oregon, and that there shall be one polling place for said special election, namely, in the City Hall, 926 Main Street, Milwaukie, Oregon, at which polling place all legal voters shall vote, and which polling place shall be open from 8:00 o'clock a.m., to 8:00 o'clock p.m., Pacific Standard Time.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF MILWAUKIE, OREGON, that the following named persons, all legal voters of the City of Milwaukie, Oregon be and they are hereby designated and appointed as chairman and clerks of election, to act as the election board at such polling place, and on such date, to-wit:

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF MILWAUKIE, OREGON, that the Recorder of the City of Milwaukie, Oregon, be and he hereby is empowered and ordered to make all other arrangements and to secure the necessary supplies for said special election.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF MILWAUKIE, OREGON, that the Recorder of the City of Milwaukie, Oregon, be and he hereby is directed to give at least ten (10) days' notice of the special election hereby called by posting notices thereof in not less than three public places within the boundaries of Milwaukie, Oregon, and by publishing said notice once in the official city newspaper, The Milwaukie Review, The said notice shall be in the following form:

On the 15th day of March, 1963, in the City of Milwaukie, Oregon, from 8:00 o'clock a.m. to 8:00 o'clock p.m., Pacific Standard Time, a special city election will be held at which a charter amendment will be submitted to the legal voters of the City of Milwaukie, Oregon, for their approval or rejection.

The following is the ballot title, the number and form in which the question will be printed on the official ballot:







WHEREAS, it has been considered and deemed necessary and expedient and for the best interests of the City of Milwaukie, Oregon, that the City of Milwaukie, Oregon, acquire and accept jurisdiction over certain portion(s) of County Road(s) lying within and adjacent to the corporate limits of said City, as the same is herewith described, and

WHEREAS, the Board of County Commissioners, pursuant to ORS 373-270, has conducted a public hearing and has deemed it to be expedient and for the best interests of the county to surrender jurisdiction over the County Road(s) herewith described, and

WHEREAS, the Board of County Commissioners has made an offer to the City of Milwaukie, Oregon, to surrender jurisdiction over said County Road(s) or portion thereof.


