COUNCIL CHAMBER

978th MEETING

The nine hundred seventy-eighth regular meeting of the Council of the City of Milwaukie, was held on the fourteenth day of January, 1963.

The meeting was called to order by temporary Chairman Theron Sedgwick.

Preceding the swearing in of the newly elected Council Members, at the request of the Mayor elect, Joseph M. Bernard, Jr., there was an invocation given by Father Brennan of the St. Johns Catholic Church.

Joseph M. Bernard, Jr., who was duly elected as Mayor of the City of Milwaukie, Oregon at an election held in said City for that purpose on November 6, 1962, then presented himself to the Council and duly took and made the oath required of him by reason of his election to that office. Upon so making the oath required by the City Charter, Mr. Joseph M. Bernard, Jr., assumed his office and position as Mayor of the City of Milwaukie, Oregon and as Chairman of the City Council.

Robert E. Richmond and Walter J. Freeman, who were duly elected as members of the City Council of the City of Milwaukie, Oregon, at an election held in said City for that purpose on November 6, 1962, then presented themselves to the City Council and each took and made the oath required of him by reason of election to that office. Upon so making the oath so required by the City Charter, Mr. Robert E. Richmond and Mr. Walter J. Freeman each duly assumed his position and office as a member of the City Council of the City of Milwaukie, Oregon.

The minutes of the nine hundred seventy-seventh regular meeting of the Council, held on the tenth day of December, 1962 were approved as written.

The minutes of a special meeting held on the fourteenth day of December, 1962 were approved as written.

The Mayor requested that letters of appreciation, for services rendered to the City, be sent to those officers of the City, retiring at this time; Earl M. Clay, retiring as Mayor; Dr. James M. Howard and Paul Baer, retiring as councilmen.

The Mayor then made the following Proclamation:

Nays: None. Ordinance Number 954 passed the Council and was so declared by the Mayor.

The Mayor appointed Mr. Paul Baerx to the Planning Commission to fill the unexpired term of Max Thompson.

The Mayor introduced Mr. Tom Monaghan, the newly elected State Senator.

The time having arrived the Mayor opened the hearing on the assessment for the improvement of Madison Street from 30th Street West to Hennemans Acres and called for objections to the same. There was no citizen present who made objection and no written objection had been received the Mayor declared the hearing closed.

Ordinance No. 955 was taken up and read for its first reading. It was moved by Sedgwick and seconded by Richmond that Ordinance No. 955 be passed to its second reading and that it be read at this time. Ordinance Number 955 AN ORDINANCE declaring the assessment for the improvement of Madison Street from 30th Street Westerly to Henneman's Acres, by curbs and asphaltic pavement, and declaring an emergency, was again taken up and read and put on its passage with the following result being had. Ayes: Sedgwick, Renard, Richmond, Freeman and Bernard. Nays: None. Ordinance Number 955 passed the Council and was so declared by the Mayor.

The Mayor opened the hearing on the question of withdrawal of properties annexed by Ordinance No. 952 from the Wichita Zoning District and called for objection to the same. There was no person present who objected and no written objection had been received. The Mayor declared the hearing closed.

The Mayor opened the hearing on the assessment for the 47th Street L Logus Road Sewer and called for objection to the same. There were citizens present who asked questions which Mr. Osborne explained and since there were no further questions and no objections the Mayor declared the hearing closed.

The Mayor then appointed the following councilmen to act in certain areas of responsibility:

Councilman Sedgwick to - Utilities, Roads and Construction  
 Councilman Renard to - Codes, Ordinances and Licenses  
 Councilman Freeman to - Industrial Development  
 Councilman Richmond to - City Personnel Problems  
 and to himself the area of parks and recreation.

Mr. William Hupp, representing the Milwaukie Boosters, requested the council to draw an ordinance covering the littering of the city streets especially enforcing the use of the newly posted trash receptacles on Main Street and also for protection of same. Council directed the city attorney to prepare such an ordinance.

Mr. Nickles congratulated the Mayor and welcomed him to the Planning Commission which meets Tuesday, January 15, 1963.

Mr. Raymond Gitch, 3716 Lake Road, complained about his neighbors horse running loose and trespassing on his property. He was advised to present his problem to the Planning Commission or file a complaint with the police department.

Mr. Fred Weber came before the council and reported that there were six completed dwellings in Cedarcrest and there were 50 more under construction and he was now in dire need of water; that he had been assured that water would be available to the Cedarcrest project when he was ready for it. The Mayor suggested that this matter be investigated and that it be brought up at a special meeting on January 21, 1963.

Ordinance No. 956 was taken up and read for its first reading. It was moved by Sedgwick and seconded by Richmond that Ordinance No. 956 be passed to its second reading and that it be read at this time. Ordinance Number 956 AN ORDINANCE providing for the procedure to annex, without election, certain territory, contiguous to the present boundaries of the City of Milwaukie, Clackamas County, Oregon, fixing a day for public hearing before the City Council of the City of Milwaukie, Oregon on the question of such annexation, directing publication of notice of such hearing, and declaring an emergency. was again taken up and read and put on its passage with the following result being had. Ayes: Sedgwick, Richmond, Renard, Freeman, Beranrd, Nays: None. Ordinance Number 956 passed the Council and was so declared by the Mayor.

Ordinance Number 957 was taken up and read for its first reading. It was moved by Sedgwick and seconded by Richmond that Ordinance No. 957 be passed to its second reading and that it be read at this time. Ordinance Number 957 AN ORDINANCE declaring the assessment for the construction of sanitary sewers and connection laterals along 47th Street from Rockwood Street to Logus Road and along Logus Road from 47th Street Easterly a distance of approximately 700 feet and declaring an emergency, was taken up again and read and put on its passage with the following result being had. Ayes: Sedgwick, Richmond, Renard, Freeman Bernard. Nays: None. Ordinance No. 957 passed the Council and was so ordered by the Mayor.

Ordinance No. 958 was taken up and read for its first reading. It was moved by Sedgwick and seconded by Richmond that Ordinance No. 958 be passed to its second reading and that it be read at this time. Ordinance No. 958 AN ORDINANCE withdrawing from the Wichita Zoning District, Clackamas County, Oregon, those parts of said district heretofore annexed to and incorporated within the city boundaries of the City of Milwaukie, Oregon, was again taken up and read and put on its passage with the following result being had. Ayes: Sedgwick, Richmond, Renard Freeman, Bernard. Nays: None. Ordinance No. 958 passed the Council and was so ordered by the Mayor.

Manager Mullan reported on the opening of bids for gasoline and fuel oil for 1963. The bids were as follows:

It was moved by Renard and seconded by Sedgwick that the lowest bids be accepted after checking and approved by the Manager. Motion carried and so ordered by the Mayor.

Manager Mullan reported on the matter of a new 16" well for the Water Department. Mr. Mullan stated that Strasser Drilling Co. was the only firm who made an estimate of cost which was \$8,300.00 for the drilling

of the well and \$6,900.00 for the pump. It was decided that this question would be again taken up at the meeting of January 21st.

Manager Mullan reported that Pump Pipe & Power Co. had given him an estimated cost of \$1272.00 for Auxiliary Emergency Pumping Equipment for the Water Department. It was decided that further discussion on this matter would be taken up at the special meeting.

Manager Mullan reported that he had received a letter from the government and they stated they would not pay for the Sewage Treatment Plant until the project is completed when the landscaping is done this spring.

Attorney Sheldahl requested the city to purchase volume for \$10.00 called "Municipal Law" by Chas. Rien. It was moved by Sedgwick and seconded by Freeman that Attorney Sheldahl be authorized to purchase this volume.

There was discussion on the matter of the one-way traffic on Main Street. There were those present who talked both for and against the one-way traffic. It was moved by Richmond that Resolution 43-1962 be rescinded and that Main Street be restored to two-way traffic. The motion died for lack of a second.

Mr. Renard stated that he would contact the League of Oregon Cities and have a traffic engineer make a survey of this problem.

Mr. Garland Taylor, operator of Milwaukie Transfer and Fuel Co., stated that he had not been notified of the bids for furnishing the city with gasoline and fuel oil. After discussion it was moved by Richmond and seconded by Freeman that the motion previously made on this matter be rescinded and that a new date be set for the opening of these bids and that notice of same be published in the Milwaukie Review. Motion carried and so ordered.

Mr. Garland Taylor reported that 31st Street between Harrison and Meek Streets was in bad condition and requested that necessary repairs be made.

Councilman Renard reported on a meeting he attended at the League of Oregon Cities Convention and the advantages the city may gain from recodification of its ordinances and recommended we look into this matter.


