Ordinance Number 361 entitled: "An Ordinance providing for the issuance and sale of Milwaukie Refunding Sewer Bonds in the sum of Five Thousand dollars (\$5,000.00) for the purpose of refunding and retiring outstanding sewer bonds, providing the form of said bonds and the sale thereof, and declaring an emergency." was taken up for consideration and read for the first time. No objection being made Ordinance Number 361 was read for the second time by title only. There being no objection Ordinance Number 361 was read for the third time by title only. Ordinance Number 361 was put on its passage with the following result being had: Ayes: Burdick, Dell, Shrock, Walsh and Wills; Noes, None. Ordinance Number 361 passed the Council.

It was moved by Walsh and seconded by Burdick that L.A. Maple be paid \$17.50 for his services as traffic officer during February. Motion carried and so ordered.

It was moved by Burdick and seconded by Shrock that the old Remington typewriter of the City be sold for \$8.00. Motion carried and so ordered.

COUNCIL CHAMBERS, APRIL 13, 1936

The four hundred seventeenth regular meeting of the Council of Milwaukie was held on the 13th day of April, 1936.

Present: Mayor Sanders; Councilmen Burdick, Dell, Walsh and Wills; Marshal Riley; Water Superintendent Bevington; Fire Chief Lewellyn, and Recorder Adams.

The minutes of the four hundred fifteenth and four hundred sixteenth regular meetings of the Council held respectively on the 9th and 23rd days of March, 1936 were each read and were each approved as read.

The Recorder opened and read the following sealed bids for \$5,000

2. Bid for all of said bonds, drawing interest at the rate of 4 per cent per annum, at 101.25, plus accrued interest, by First State Bank of Milwaukie, Milwaukie, Oregon, accompanied by a certified check for \$100.00.
3. Bid for all of said bonds, drawing interest at the rate of 3% per annum, at 100.86, plus accrued interest, by Federal Securities Company, accompanied by a certified check for \$100.00.
4. Bid for all of said bonds, drawing interest at the rate of 2-¾% per annum, at 100.17, plus accrued interest, by Marshal Wright & Company, accompanied by a certified check for \$100.00.
5. Bid for all of said bonds, drawing interest at the rate of 3½% per annum, at 100.08, plus accrued interest, by Universal Bond & Mortgage Corporation, accompanied by a certified check for \$100.00.
6. Bid for all of said bonds, drawing interest at the rate of 3% per annum, at 100.078, plus accrued interest, by Baker, Fordyce Co., accompanied by a certified check for \$100.00.
7. Bid for \$500.00 of said bonds, drawing interest at the rate of 5% per annum, at \$100.00, by Mary E. Gapiard, accompanied by a certified check for \$100.00.

It was moved by Burdick, seconded by Walsh that the above bid of Mess, Tripp & Butchart be accepted, and that the Recorder deliver the bonds and receive payment therefor on behalf of Milwaukie as soon as the bonds become available.
