

The Recorder reported that Edlefson & Weygandt contractors had commenced hauling gravel over the City's streets and suggested that an ordinance be prepared and posted requiring a bond of haulers of gravel. No action was taken.

Complaint was made of the condition of the sidewalk abutting the property of Fred Hager on Washington Street. Street Commissioner Bevington was instructed to straighten the matter out.

Street Commissioner Bevington reported that Bell Sand & Gravel Co. desired to purchase the small grader owned by the City. It was moved by Walsh and seconded by Dell that the Recorder negotiate the sale of the small grader and sell the same to Bell Sand & Gravel Co. for \$150 if possible.

Council Chambers  
Milwaukie, Oregon  
May 14, 1934.

The three hundred eighty-fifth regular meeting of the Council of the Town of Milwaukie was held in the Council Chambers on the 14th day of May, 1934. Present: Mayor Miller, Councilmen Dell, Sanders and Shrock; Recorder Adams, Marshal Riley and Water Superintendent Bevington.

The Treasurer's report was read.

The minutes of the three hundred eighty-fourth regular meeting of the City Council held on the 9th day of April, 1934, were read and were approved as read.

Councilman Dell reported that the matter of the large water bill rendered for March had been taken up with officials of the City of Portland and that a reduction of \$37.00 had been secured.

The Recorder reported that the Hawley Pulp & Paper Co. had agreed to remove the debris on its Front Street property within the near future.

The matter of joining in with Stanley and Witchita water districts for the purpose of buying water from Portland together and thereby gaining the benefit was taken up for consideration. The Engineer's report showed that about 400 feet of pipe would have to be layed to accomplish the purpose and estimated the cost at being \$1500.00. The matter was referred to the Engineer and Recorder for further study.

The matter of reducing water rates on quantities of water used over the minimum was taken up for consideration. The Auditor and Recorder submitted a joint letter citing figures regarding the effect such a reduction would have on revenues of the water department and the meeting of the obligations and operating expenses of the water department and recommending that any reduction be delayed until the water department was in better financial condition. After considerable discussion it was

moved by Dell and seconded by Sanders that the matter be layed on the table. Ayes Dell, Sanders and Shrock. Noes: None. Carried and so ordered,

Ordinance No. 342 entitled "An Ordinance requiring trucks hauling gravel and or earth in the discretion of the Council to secure permits and declaring an emergency". was taken up and read for the first time. The roll call being taken on the first reading the following result was had. Ayes: Dell, Sanders and Shrock. Noes, none. Ordinance No. 342 passed the first reading. Upon motion duly made and carried the rules were suspended and Ordinance Number 342 was taken up for the second reading and read by title only. The roll call being taken on the second reading the following result was had. Ayes, Dell, Sanders and Shrock. Noes, None. Ordinance Number 342 passed the second reading. Upon motion duly made and carried the rules were suspended and Ordinance No. 342 was taken up for the third reading and read by title only. The roll call being taken on the third reading the following result was had: Ayes: Dell, Sanders and Shrock. Noes, none. Ordinance No. 342 passed the third and final reading.

The Recorder reported that he had been requested by Mrs. J.A. Keck to place before the Council a proposal that the Keck heirs would give a deed to Blocks 7 and 8 in block 29. The matter was layed on the table until the next meeting.

The Recorder reported that it would be necessary under the provisions of the State Workmen's Compensation Act for the Council to appoint some official to sign reports to the State Industrial Accident Commission for S.E.R.A. work in the City. It was moved by Sanders and seconded by Shrock that the Mayor be designated to sign such reports. Ayes, Dell, Sanders, Shrock. Noes, none. Carried and so ordered.

The Recorder reported that the City had purchased lots 7 and 8 Block 1 Quincy Addition at a sale on account of delinquent assessment in 1934 but had never recorded its deed; that the Bank of Sellwood had a mortgage upon the property secured since the date of the sale to the City; that the City had \$62 in principal and interest against the property; that he had asked the Bank of Sellwood to pay the same; that the Bank of Sellwood claimed that inasmuch as the City's deed had not been recorded it did not have to pay the City but would pay one-half of the city's claim. The Recorder recommended that the offer be accepted since he doubted that the claim could be collected. It was moved by Shrock and seconded by Dell that the offer be accepted. Ayes: Dell, Sanders, Shrock. Noes. None. Carried and so ordered.

R.M. River was appointed Supervisor of SERA projects for Milwaukie with the understanding that his compensation was to be paid by the Federal govt.

The following bills were read, and it was moved by Shrock and seconded by Sanders that the Recorder issue warrants in payment of the same. Ayes, Dell, Sanders, Shrock. Noes, None. Carried and so ordered.
