

TOWN HALL, MILWAUKIE, OREGON, AUGUST 11TH. 1925.

The two hundred eighty-first regular meeting of the Council of the Town of Milwaukie was held on the 11th day of August, 1925.

Meeting called to order by Mayor Cowell. Present, Mayor Cowell, Councilmen Hazen, McIntyre, Kelso and Ramsey, Recorder Mathews and Marshal Keck. The minutes of the two hundred eightieth regular meeting of the Council held on the 14th. day of July, 1925, and the minutes of the two adjourned meetings of the two hundred eightieth regular meeting of the Council held on the 17th. and 27th. days of July, 1925, respectively were read and approved as read. The Committee appointed to interview Mr. B. M. Fisch in regard to constructing a bridge over the stream crossing Monroe Street reported that they had seen Mr. Fisch and that it would be satisfactory to Mr. Fisch to construct a bridge with a 16 foot span and put buttresses on each side and fill in with dirt. Upon motion duly made and carried, the City Engineer was instructed to prepare plans and specifications for a bridge on Monroe Street.

A communication from Commissioner Bigelow of Portland granting the Town of Milwaukie the privilege for 90 days to use Portland's garbage dump was read and ordered placed on file. A communication from County Judge Cross informing the Council that Clackamas County would do the city's paving was read and ordered placed on file. The application of Sam Riley for a ten day paid vacation was read and upon motion duly made and carried, the application was granted. Upon motion duly made and carried, Ordinance No. 228 entitled "An ordinance amending Section (4) of Ordinance No. 139 and declaring an emergency", was taken up for the first reading. The Ordinance being read the roll call showed the following result: Ayes, Ramsey, Kelso, McIntyre and Hazen. Nays, none. Ordinance No. 228 passed the first reading. Upon motion duly made and carried, the rules were suspended and ordinance No. 228 was taken up for the second reading and read by title only. The roll-call showed the following result; Ayes, Ramsey, Kelso, McIntyre and Hazen. Nays, none. Ordinance No. 228 passed the second reading. Upon motion duly made and carried, the rules were suspended and ordinance No. 228 was taken up for the third and final reading and read by title only.

There being no objections made or filed to the improvement of East Monroe Street, Ordinance No. 230 entitled "An ordinance providing for the improvement of East Monroe Street in the Town of Milwaukie, Oregon, from Oak Street to 42nd. Street, and declaring an emergency", was read and ordered posted as required by the City Charter. The City Engineer having filed in the Office of the Recorder plans and specifications for the improvement of 28th. Street from the south property line of Harrison Street to the north property line of Washington Street, and estimates of the work to be done and the probable cost thereof, and said plans, specifications and estimates being satisfactory to the Council, the following resolution was read and upon motion duly made and carried was unanimously adopted as read:

RESOLUTION AND NOTICE OF THE IMPROVEMENT OF 28th. STREET FROM THE SOUTH PROPERTY LINE OF HARRISON STREET TO THE NORTH PROPERTY LINE OF WASHINGTON STREET.

Whereas, pursuant to an order of the Council of the Town of Milwaukie, Oregon, heretofore made, the City Engineer has filed his report and filed in the Office of the Recorder of said Town plans and specifications for an appropriate improvement of 28th. Street from the South property line of Harrison Street to the North property line of Washington Street, according to the petition therefor, heretofore filed with the Recorder of said Town, together with an estimate of the work to be done and the probable cost thereof, and whereas, said plans, Specifications and estimates are satisfactory to the Council of the Town of Milwaukie, Oregon:

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE TOWN OF MILWAUKIE, OREGON, that said plans, specifications and estimates be and the same are hereby approved and adopted. And be it further resolved that it is the purpose and intention of the Town of Milwaukie, Oregon, by its Council to make said improvement, described as follows, to-wit:

(1). That said 28th. Street shall be improved from the south property line of Harrison Street to the North property line of Washington Street by grading said street the full width to the established grade.

(2). By constructing a crushed rock roadway eighteen feet in width and six inches in thickness the full length of said street.

(3). By constructing one course cement sidewalks four feet in width and four inches in thickness on both sides of said street the full length thereof.

(4). By constructing all necessary crosswalks, catch-basins and drains. All work to be done in accordance with the plans and specifications heretofore filed with the Recorder of the Town of Milwaukie, and approved by this resolution.

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Remonstrances against said improvement may be filed in writing with the Recorder of the Town of Milwaukie on or before the 25th. day of August, 1925.

The Recorder of the Town of Milwaukie is hereby directed to cause this notice and resolution to be posted as required by the Charter of the Town of Milwaukie, Oregon.

Upon motion duly made and carried, it was ordered that the following streets be paved at the same time the other streets were being paved: 29th Street from Harrison Street to Washington Street; Jackson Street between Front Street and Main Street and 27th. Street to the south limit of the Grammar School. The said streets to be paved sixteen feet in width.

Upon motion duly made and carried, it was ordered that 30th. 31st. 32nd streets and west Monroe Street be repaired by scarifying, rolling and placing crushed rock on the same. Upon motion duly made and carried, the City Engineer was instructed to have Clackamas County start paving at 27th. & Washington Streets. Upon motion duly made and carried, the Recorder was instructed to prepare an ordinance licensing breeders' of dogs in the Town of Milwaukie. The following bills were read and allowed by the Finance Committee and upon motion duly made and carried, the recorder was instructed to draw warrants in payment of the same:
