An adjourned meeting of the two hundred sixty-sixth regular meeting of the Council was held on the above named date. Meeting called to order by J. J. Miller, president of the Council. Present, Councilmen Miller, Kerr, McIntyre and Kleeb, Recorder Mathews and Marshal Keck.

Upon motion duly made and carried, ordinance No. 215 entitled, "An ordinance providing for the improvement of Harvey Street, in the Town of Milwaukie, Oregon, from the east line of 32nd. Street, easterly to the City Limits of the Town of Milwaukie, and declaring an emergency," was taken up for the first reading. The Ordinance being read the roll-call showed the following result: Ayes, Kerr, McIntyre and Kleeb. Nays, none. Ordinance No. 215 passed the first reading. Upon motion duly made and carried, the rules were suspended and ordinance No. 215 was taken up for the second reading and read by title only. The roll-call showed the following result: Ayes, Kerr, McIntyre and Kleeb. Nays, none. Ordinance No. 215 passed the second reading. Upon motion duly made and carried, the rules were suspended and ordinance No. 215 was taken up for the third and final reading and read by title only. The roll-call showed the following result: Ayes, Kerr, McIntyre and Kleeb. Nays, none. Ordinance No. 215 passed. Upon motion duly made and carried, the Recorder was instructed to advertise for bids for the improvement of Harvey Street in the Daily-Record Abstract for a period of 5 days, said bids to be opened the 10th day of June, 1924. Upon motion duly made and carried, the Mayor was requested to appoint Fred Karlen, a deputy Marshal for the Town of Milwaukie, to act as such during his proper conduct as such Deputy Marshal. Upon motion duly made and carried, the Recorder was instructed to prepare an ordinance prohibiting the sale and discharge of Firecrackers and fireworks within the Town of Milwaukie and post the same as required by the City Charter. Upon motion duly made and carried, the Council adjourned.

TOWN HALL, MILWAUKIE, OREGON, JUNE 10TH. 1924.

The Two hundred sixty-seventh regular meeting of the Council of the Town of Milwaukie, was held on the 10th. day of June, 1924. Meeting called to order by Mayor Cowell. Present, Mayor Cowell, Councilmen Johnson, Kerr, Miller, McIntyre and Kleeb, Recorder Mathews and Marshal Keck. The minutes of the two hundred sixty-sixth regular meeting of the Council held on the 10th day of ~~May~~ 1924, and the minutes of the adjourned meetings of the Council held on the 17th. day of May, 1924, and on the 3rd. day of June, 1924, were read and approved as read.

A communication from the City of Portland in regard to Milwaukie constructing a reservoir to be used in case of an emergency was read, and the Mayor and Recorder were requested to see the Water Supt. of Portland in regard to the same. Upon motion duly made and carried, the proposals for the improvement of Harvey Street were opened and read, which proposals were as follows, to-wit: R. Lee---- \$2820.00: H. W. Oliver---- \$2614.00. The bid of H. W. Oliver being the lowest bid for the improvement of Harvey Street, upon motion duly made and carried, the contract for the improvement of Harvey Street was awarded to H. W. Oliver for the sum of \$2614.00. The Recorder was instructed to prepare a contract between the Town of Milwaukie and H. W. Oliver for the improvement of Harvey Street, and upon motion duly made and carried, the Mayor and Recorder were instructed to execute said contract on behalf of the Town of Milwaukie. Upon motion duly made and carried, the Recorder was instructed to return Mr. Lee's ~~his~~ certified check. Mr. Perry and Mr. Hart was present and protested against the passage of the firecracker ordinance.

Upon motion duly made and carried, action on the firecracker ordinance was postponed until the 20th day of June, 1924. The Finance Committee was instructed to take up the matter of the unpaid assessments on Front Street with the City Treasurer and make some arraignments for taking care of the bonds due.

The following bills were read and allowed by the Finance Committee and upon motion duly made and carried, the Recorder was instructed to draw warrants in payment of the same:
