

## TOWN HALL, MILWAUKIE, OREGON, MAY 2ND. 1922.

The two hundred forty-second (242) regular meeting of the Council of the Town of Milwaukie, was held on the 2nd day of May, 1922.

Meeting called to order by Councilman Miller Present, Mayor Snyder, Councilmen, Albee, Shindler, Miller, Hart and Counsell, Recorder Mathews and Marshal Keck. The minutes of the two hundred forty-first regular meeting of the Council held on the 4th day of April, 1922, and of the adjourned meeting of the two hundred forty-first regular meeting held on the 10th day of April, 1922, were read and approved as read. Upon motion duly made and carried, the recorder was instructed to prepare an ordinance prohibiting the loading and unloading of manure of an offensive order within the Town of Milwaukie. Mr. Counsell informed the Council that it would be necessary for the Town to purchase some asphalt to repair Front Street and Lake Road. Upon motion duly made and carried, Mr. Counsell was authorized to purchase what asphalt was necessary to repair the Streets. Upon motion duly made and carried, ordinance number 179 entitled, "An ordinance adopting the report of the Viewers on the proposed extension of Harrison Street from 34th Street easterly to the northeast corner of the Lot Whitcomb D. L. C, and declaring an emergency," was taken up for the first reading. The ordinance being read the roll-call showed the following result: Ayes, Shindler, Albee, Miller, Hart and Council. Nays, none. Ordinance No. 179 passed the first reading. Upon motion duly made and carried, the rules were suspended and ordinance No. 179 was taken up for the second reading and read by title only. The roll-called showed the following result: Ayes, Shindler, Albee, Miller, Hart and Counsell. Nays, none. Ordinance No. 179 passed the second reading. Upon motion duly made and carried, the rules were suspended and ordinance No. 179 was taken up for the third and final reading and read by title only. The Roll-call showed the following result: Ayes, Shindler, Albee, Miller, Hart and Counsell. Nays, none. Ordinance No. 179 passed. Ordinance No. 180 entitled, "An ordinance prohibiting the dumping of garbage, rubbish or other refuse material on any public or private ground within the Town of Milwaukie, Oregon, and providing a penalty for the violation of the provisions of this ordinance," was read and ordered posted as required by the City Charter. A petition for the improvement of Myrtle Street was read and referred back to the petitioners to get Mr. Roberts to sign the same.

Upon motion duly made and carried, the Marshal was authorized to appoint a deputy to help with the traffic on Sundays. Upon motion duly made and carried, smoking was prohibited in the City Hall and the Marshal was instructed to post notices to that effect. Upon motion duly made and carried, the Council appropriated \$15.00 toward the purchase of a strip of land from the Wilson estate in order that 29th Street might be improved.

The following bills were read and approved by the Finance Committee and upon motion duly made and carried, the Recorder was instructed to draw warrants in payment of the same:

A special meeting of the Council of the Town of Milwaukie was held on the above named date. Meeting called to order by Mayor Snyder. Present Mayor Snyder, councilmen, Albee, Miller, Hart and Counsell, recorder Mathews and Treasurer Streib. Mayor Snyder stated that the meeting was called for the purpose of considering the furnishing of water to the Oak Lodge Water District. Mr. Catfield representing the Oak Lodge Water District was present and informed the Council that they would like to purchase water from the Town of Milwaukie if satisfactory arrangements could be made. Upon motion duly made and carried, the matter was referred to the water Committee to make a report upon at the next meeting of the Council. Upon motion duly made and carried, Mr. Miller was instructed to give W. G. Van Kuren a quitclaim deed to Lot 16, Block 2, Quincy Addition, upon Mr. Van Kuren paying the City's claim against the property for city liens and cost of transferring the same. The opinion of R. G. Skulason as to whether or not a purchaser of property on contract for deed was a freeholder was read and placed on file. Upon motion duly made and carried, the council adjourned.
