Resolution No 1-1918 An adjourned meeting of the one hundred ninety-third regular meeting of the Town Council was held on the above named date. Meeting called to order by Mayor Snyder. Present, Councilmen, Shindler, Grasle, Miller, Rates and Seavey, Recorder Mathews and Marshal Riley.

A resolution exempting the Oceanic Shipbuilding Company from City xxxxxx taxes for a period of ten years was read and upon motion duly made and carried, the resolution was adopted as read, and referred to the vote of the people at the next general election for their rejection or approval. The proclomation of Mayor Snyder fixing and declaring the day of April, 1918, a legal holiday in the Town of Milwaukie, was read and placed on file.

Upon motion duly made and carried, Ordinance No. 161 entitled " An ordinance licensing and regulating public dance halls and dances within the Town of Milwaukie, Oregon, providing a penalty for the 😁 violation thereof and declaring an emergency", was taken up for the first reading. The ordinance being read the roll-call showed the following result: Ayes, Shindler, Grasle, Miller, Pates and Seavey. Nays, none. Ordinance No. 161 passed the first reading. Upon motion duly made and carried, the rules were suspended and ordinance No. 161 was taken up for the second reading and read by title only. The roll call showed the following result: Ayes, Shindler, Grasle, Miller, Pates and Seavey. Nays, none. Ordinance No. 161 passed the second reading. Upon motion duly made and carried, the rules were suspended and ordinance No. 161 was taken up for the third and final reading and read by title only. The roll call showed the following result: Ayes, Shindler, Grasle, Miller, Rates and seavey. Nays, none. The application of M. M. Ringler for a dance hall license and a dance license was read. Moved by councilman Miller and seconded by councilman Shindler that M. M. Ringler be granted a dance hall license and a dance license. Councilman Shindler and Miller voting for the motion and councilman Grasle and Rates voting against the motion. The vote being a tie the Mayor cast the deciding vote in favor of the motion. Motion carried. Upon motion duly made and carried, the recorder and mayor were instructed to issue said licenses to M. M. Ringler.

The following bills were read and allowed by the Finance Committee and upon motion duly made and carried, the Recorder was

instructed to draw warrants in payment of the same:

Upon motion duly made and carried, the Council adjourned.

Town Hall, Milwaukie, Oregon, April 6th. 1918.

A special meeting of the Council was held on the above named date. Meeting called to order by Mayor Snyder. Present, Mayor Snyder, councilmen, Shindler, Grasle, Miller, Pates and Seavey, Recorder Mathews and Marshal Riley. Mayor Snyder stated that the meeting was called for the purpose of reconsidering the action of the Council in granting Mr. Ringler a dance hall license and dance license. Mr. Robinson representing the War Department was present and produced eveidence to show that Mr. Ringler was not conducting his dances in a proper manner and that it would be gained against the public morals and welfare to allow him to conduct dances in the Town of Milwaukie, and that if the Council did not close his dance hall the War Department would. Upon motion of Councilman Grasle seconded by councilman Miller and carried, the action of the Council in granting M. M. Ringler a dance hall license and a dance license was rescinded, and Mr. Ringler was denied about both a dance hall license and dance license. Upon motion duly made and carried, the council adjourned.
