

CITY COUNCIL MEETING

July 22, 1968

COUNCIL CHAMBERS

1084th Meeting

The one thousand eighty-fourth meeting of the Council of the City of Milwaukie, Oregon, was held on the 22nd day of July, 1968. The meeting was called to order by Mayor Robert Richmond with the following Councilmen present:

It was moved by Slominski, seconded by Graf, that the minutes of the regular meeting of July 8 and the special meeting of July 15, 1968, be approved as written. Motion carried and so ordered.

AUDIENCE PARTICIPATION

The Council was asked, by a member of the audience, what the City's position now was with regard to the Oregon Liquor Control Commission granting the Chalet L'Abbe the license for serving hard liquor.

The City Attorney advised that there were several courses of action that could be taken; however, before any definite decision is reached, there will be further study made by the Council.

ROBERT KENNEDY, 2936 Monroe Street, came before the Council with regard to the early operation of the street equipment being used by the State Highway Department on Monroe and Harrison Streets, causing excessive noise to the neighbors.

Inasmuch as the City does have a nuisance ordinance in effect, it was agreed that this was an administrative matter, with the enforcement of the ordinance to be handled by the City Manager.

It was moved by Strauss, seconded by Clore, that the next item of business be taken up for discussion. Motion carried and so ordered.

CORRESPONDENCE

Letter from International Harvester Co., dated July 17, was read. It was requested that the name of Harvester Drive NOT be changed.

A memo from the Planning Commission was also received, recommending to the Council that the request for name change of Harvester Drive to Hanna Drive be denied.

It was moved by Slominski, seconded by Clore, that the Council accept the recommendation of the Planning Commission and deny the request for name change of Harvester Drive. Notification to be sent to all interested parties. Motion carried and so ordered.

PETITION - Traffic congestion and noise, 26th Street

A petition with twenty signatures had been received, requesting that several courses of action be taken to alleviate the excessive congestion of traffic and noise on 26th Street. Mr. Clarence Depew, 2035 - 26th Street addressed the Council with regard to this matter.

The Manager pointed out that the City would not be able to carry out the recommendations requested as it would involve use of private property over which the City has no control.

Mayor suggested that the owners of the Lake Village Apartments be made aware of the complaints of the surrounding neighbors and attempt to correct the situation.

COST ESTIMATE ON BOYD STREET IMPROVEMENT

An estimate of street improvement on Boyd Street was prepared and presented by the City Engineer, for review by the Council. Estimated cost per front foot including storm drains was \$15.20; estimated cost per front foot without storm drains was \$9.20.

(Recess at 8:35 p. m. , reconvened at 8:50 with all present)

It was moved by Slominski, seconded by Clore, that a public hearing be set for August 12, 8:00 p. m. , on the question of formation of an Local Improvement District on Boyd Street. Resolution setting hearing date to be drawn up for adoption by the Council on the 29th of July, at special meeting called by the Mayor. Motion carried and so ordered.

OTHER BUSINESS

Councilman Clore asked to be brought up-to-date on the action taken with regard to the Turk property in the Cedarcrest area. The Attorney advised that he had contacted Mr. Turk's attorney and was advised that supports would be put up where necessary on the partially completed construction. If this has not yet been done, a complaint will be drawn up and served.

Mayor announced that dedication services for Century Park will be held on July 29 at 7:30 p. m.

PAYMENT OF BILLS

It was moved by Graf, seconded by Slominski, that the bills listed for July 23, 1968 payment be approved and that warrants be drawn for payment of same. Motion carried and so ordered.
