

Council Chamber, Milwaukie, Oregon, Dec. 12-32

The three hundred sixty-ninth regular meeting of the Council of Milwaukie was held on the 12th. day of December, 1932. Meeting called to order by Mayor Miller. Present, Mayor Miller, Councilmen Sanders, Shrock and Walsh, Recorder Mathews and Marshal Keck. The minutes of the three hundred sixty-eighth regular meeting of the Council held on the 14th. day of November, 1932, and the minutes of the special meetings of the Council held on the 25th. day of November, 1932, and on the 7th. day of December, 1932, were read and approved as read.

A communication from J. Edward Thornton, Mayor of Ashland, Oregon, requesting the Council to contribute to a fund to be used at the coming session of the Legislature for the purpose of defeating any attempt to tax municipal utilities was read, and upon motion duly made and carried, it was ordered that the sum of \$20.00 be appropriated for that purpose, and the Recorder was instructed to draw a warrant on the emergency fund in favor of J. Edward Thornton in the amount of \$20.00.

The application of H. W. Boylan for the position of traffic officer was read, and the Recorder was instructed to advise Mr. Boylan that the Council did not contemplate employing a traffic officer. The report of the City Treasurer was read and placed on file.

Mayor Miller stated that A. W. Lambert & Son desired an option to purchase Lots 7 and 8, Block 28, Milwaukie, and that he desired to know the wish of the Council in the matter and the price to be asked for the property. Upon motion duly made and carried, it was ordered that A. W. Lambert & Son be given a sixty day option to purchase Lots 7 and 8, Block 28, Milwaukie, for the purchase price of \$5000.00; provided they pay the city \$15.00 for the option.

Mr. Maple was present and requested the use of the East Milwaukie Fire Station for the Unemployed League of Milwaukie, Oregon.

Upon motion duly made and carried, it was ordered that the Unemployed League of Milwaukie, Oregon, be given a revocable permit to use the East Milwaukie Fire Station for relief work and to hold such meetings as may be necessary to look after the needs of the unemployed in Milwaukie and in the immediate surrounding territory.
