

TOWN HALL, MILWAUKIE, OREGON, JAN. 15TH. 1929.

The three hundred twenty-second regular meeting of the Council of Milwaukie was held on the 15th. day of January, 1929. Meeting called to order by Mayor Miller. Present, Mayor Miller, Councilmen Sanders, Shindler, Dell and Dean, Recorder Mathews and Marshal Keck/

The minutes of the three hundred twenty-first regular meeting of the Council held on the 10th. day of December, 1928, were read and approved as read. Mayor Miller appointed the following committees for the years 1929 and 1930: Finance: W. J. Dell, L. Shindler and J. R. Earl. Streets and Lighting: C. F. Dean, W. Snaders and W. J. Dell. Water: J. R. Earl, W. Sanders and C. F. Dean. Sewer: L. Shindler, C. F. Dean and W. Sanders. Buildings, Fire & Police: W. J. Dell, J. R. Earl and L. Shindler. The Street Committee reported that they had seen Mrs. Woodward in regard to the extension of Willard Street through her property and that she had advised them that she wanted to talk to her son before making a decision, and that the Committee had later called on Mrs. Woodward but she was ill and that they did not get to talk to her in regard to the matter and were advised that she had employed an attorney to look after her interest. Mr. Moffitt was present and requested permission to put up a sign to keep heavy traffic off of Scott Street as his wife was very ill. The request was granted; provided that the signs be placed on the parking or painted on the pavement.

The report of the City Treasurer was read and ordered placed on file. The application of Nicholas Bros. for the position of City Engineer was read and referred to the Street Committee. The application of Geo. C. Hazelton for the position of Water Supt. was read and ordered placed on file. A petition for the improvement of Jefferson Street from 37th. Street easterly to the city limits was read and referred to the Street Committee. ~~Councilman Shindler~~ advised the Council that Mrs. Quant was having trouble with the manhole on her property. The matter was referred to the Sewer Committee for investigation. Mr. Kelso advised the Council that Mrs. Scott desired to purchase the property on 29th. Street belonging to the City. The Council authorized Mr. Kelso to advise Mrs. Scott to make the city an offer for the property in writing and that the Council would consider the same.
