

MEETING OF MARCH 14, 1949.

COUNCIL CHAMBERS

720th MEETING

The seven hundred twentieth regular meeting of the Council was held on the fourteen day of March, 1949.

The meeting was called to order by Mayor Sperr.

Present: Mayor Sperr; Councilmen Taylor, Mortensen, Frady, and Norbeck; Manager Taber, Attorney Kirkpatrick, and Recorder Martin.

The minutes of the seven hundred nineteenth regular meeting of the Council, held on the twenty-eighth day of February, 1949, were approved as written.

The minutes of a special meeting of the Council, held on the eleventh day of March, 1949, were read and approved as read.

A letter from Western Door and Plywood Corporation in which they requested that the vacation of Moss Street be postponed until they could make investigation of the matter, was read. It was moved by Mortensen and seconded by Norbeck that the second reading of Ordinance Number 522 be postponed at least thirty days. Motion carried and so ordered.

Mr. Delmer McClure came before the Council and requested permission to do automobile repair work in a private garage at his home. Mr. McClure presented a petition signed by all the immediate neighbors stating that they had no objection to his working in the garage. It was moved by Mortensen and seconded by Frady that Delmer McClure be granted permission to do automobile repair work in a private garage at 3110 Elmer Street, said permit to be revokable at the pleasure of the Council.

Mr. I.C. Lemly came before the Council and requested permission to move a building from 1932 Monroe Street to Lots 13,16,17, Block 16, Quincy Addition. It was moved by Frady and seconded by Taylor that before a permit to move the building be granted, Mr. Lemley be required to submit to the Manager his plans for remodeling of same into a dwelling. Motion carried and so ordered.

Mr. Ed Bolander came before the Council and brought to their attention the congested traffic condition at 21st and Jefferson Streets. It was moved by Frady and seconded by Mortensen that a temporary loading zone be marked off on the west side of 21st Street from Jefferson Street north a distance of ___feet. Motion carried and so ordered.

Manager Taber reported that he and Attorney Kirkpatrick had met with the International Harvester Corporation Western Representatives and that they had been informed that if the City of Milwaukie can and will comply with their intensions as set forth in the minutes of the special meeting of the Council on March 11, that the Harvester Corporation will act favorably on same. It was moved by Frady and seconded by Mortensen that the Mayor be authorized to sign an option with International Harvester Corporation based on the terms as shown in the minutes of the special meeting of the Council held on the eleventh of March, 1949. Motion carried and so ordered.

A letter from the Oregon State Sanitary Authority, commending Milwaukie for its progress in preparing for a sewage disposal plant, was read and ordered filed.

It was moved by Norbeck and seconded by Frady that the following bills be allowed and that the Recorder be directed to issue warrants for the payment of same.
