

MEETING OF MARCH 13, 1944

COUNCIL CHAMBERS.

600th MEETING

The six hundredth regular meeting of the Council was held on the thirteenth day of March 1944.

The meeting was called to order by Mayor Roberts.

Present: Mayor Roberts; Councilmen Newman, Bevington, McClure, Sperr and Rowe. Water Superintendant Counsell, Fire Chief Lewellyn Officer Hartwick, and Recorder Martin. Absent: Treasurer Farrington

The minutes of the five hundred ninety-ninth regular meeting of the Council held on the twenty-eighth day of February 1944 were read and approved as read.

Mr. Calvin Lewis appeared before the Council on behalf of the W J. McCready Lumber Co. and explained the nature of certain improvements done to lumber sheds on their property. It was moved by Rowe and seconded by Sperr that the Fire Chief inspect the improvements made by the J W. McCready Lumber Co. and report his findings at the next regular meeting of the Council. Motion carried and so ordered.

The matter of a Convalescent Home now under construction at Block 2 Streib's First Addition was considered by the Council.

Mr. Hans Christensen, Dr. R I Hall and friends appeared in favor of the Home. Lieutenant R. Williams appeared against it.

A petition, requesting the Council to use their influence in securing the removal of a public nuisance adjacent to their property, and signed by residents along 35th street, was read. It was moved by McClure and seconded by Newman that a copy of the petition, together with a letter from the City requesting the removal of the nuisance on account of its effect on Milwaukie property, be sent to the County Health Office and the Counth Court. Motion carried and so ordered.

The Recorder reported two unclaimed bicycles being held by the Police department and asked what disposition was to be made of them. It was agreed that the bicycles should be held at least one year.

The Fire Chief's monthly report was read and ordered filed.

It was moved by Rowe and seconded by Newman that the financial report be accepted as presented. Motion carried and so ordered.

It was moved by Newman and seconded by Rowe that Irvin Stevens be paid \$50.00 for work on City Hall and DeSmet Park grounds, Motion carried and so ordered.

It was moved by McClure and seconded by Newman that Mr. Stevens have charge of the work on the City Hall grounds and parks and that he decide how the pay was to be devided. Motion Defeated. The matter was then referred to Mrs. Newman.

It was moved by Newman and seconded by Rowe that the following bills be allowed and that the Recorder be directed to issue warrants for the payment of same.
