WHEREAS Edward 'Ed' William Zumwalt, a long-time resident and tireless supporter and friend of Milwaukie, passed away on Monday March 23, 2020; and

WHEREAS Ed lived an extraordinary life, having been born in Hong Kong in 1927, serving in the United States Navy during World War II, attending the University of Oregon, and working as a news reporter for *The Oregonian* and *The Oregon Journal*; and

WHEREAS with his partner in life, the former Patricia McHugh, Ed raised six children in Milwaukie; and


WHEREAS over the course of his six decades in our community, Ed volunteered countless hours as a member of the Ledding Library Board, the Library Expansion Task Force, the Ledding Library Foundation, the Friends of the Ledding Library, the Milwaukie Downtown Development Association, and was a founding member of Celebrate Milwaukie, Inc. and the Milwaukie Sunday Farmers' Market; and

WHEREAS Ed was a driving force in the creation of the Scott Park summer concert series and the Downtown Milwaukie First Friday events; and

WHEREAS because of his tireless devotion and service to the Milwaukie community, Ed was the first recipient of the city's Ed Zumwalt Volunteer of the Year Award in 2012 which was named in his honor.

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Mark Gamba, Mayor of the City of Milwaukie, a municipal corporation in the County of Clackamas, in the State of Oregon, do hereby memorialize the life and achievements of Edward 'Ed' Zumwalt, a pillar of the Milwaukie community for over five decades, and I ask all residents of *The Dogwood City of the West* to reflect on Ed's tireless service to our community and be inspired to continue his legacy of service.

IN WITNESS, WHEREOF, and with the consent of the City Council of the City of Milwaukie, I have hereunto set my hand on this 15th day of Month 2022.




