Highlights of the past month:

Aquatics

- Registration is currently open and for fall swimming lessons. Classes are filling up quickly.
- Staff participated in a team building exercise with the North Clackamas Aquatic Park staff.

Carnegie

- Concerts in the Park were successful in their return to the Carnegie Center with average attendance of over 900. In our surveys, people rated the quality of the program very highly.
- The fall brochure was printed and mailed
- We are redeveloping our rack brochure and expanding it to include Library Services.
- The second session of Art Camp was successful with 9 youth in attendance. The participants expressed a keen interest in the art projects.
- A new sound system has been installed in the Center.

Recreation

- Summer programs are finished for the year. Attendance was not quite as strong as we had hoped but we had added 4 weeks in partnership with OC School District and out drop in programs at Hillendale and Chapin were successful so overall participation was up.
- Other Fall classes set up and advertised in Brochure; registration being accepted.

Highlights of the past month:

Aquatics

- There have recently been some significant personnel changes within the Oregon City Swim Club. Their membership numbers are down and their finances have become tight.
- We had over 1,200 kids registered for swimming lessons this summer.
- The pool will be closed during the first two weeks of September for cleaning and maintenance that cannot be performed while we are open.

Carnegie

- Our July 8–12 Art Camp program was full with 15 kids.
- Abernethy Wood Show was very well attended and successful. The Oregon City Arts Commission received many good donation pieces.
- Summer Concerts in the Park are back at the Carnegie Center. Attendance is averaging 1,000 compared to 740 at this point last year.

Recreation

- Summer Camps are running smoothly; our numbers are lower than last summer, but kids, parents, & counselors are all having fun.
- Our third annual July 4th Celebration was successful again this year with about 3,000 people in attendance at Clackamette Park.
- We have ordered equipment for our new Indoor Playground program that begins in September at the swimming pool.
- Yoga and Pilates will have their last class of the summer next week.
- Fall classes are scheduled and will be promoted in the Fall Activity Brochure.
- We held another successful skateboarding competition at the skatepark on Saturday, August 3. The competition raised nearly \$1,000 to complete the funding for the drinking fountain.
