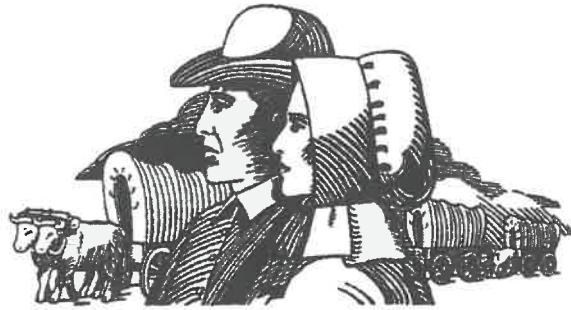

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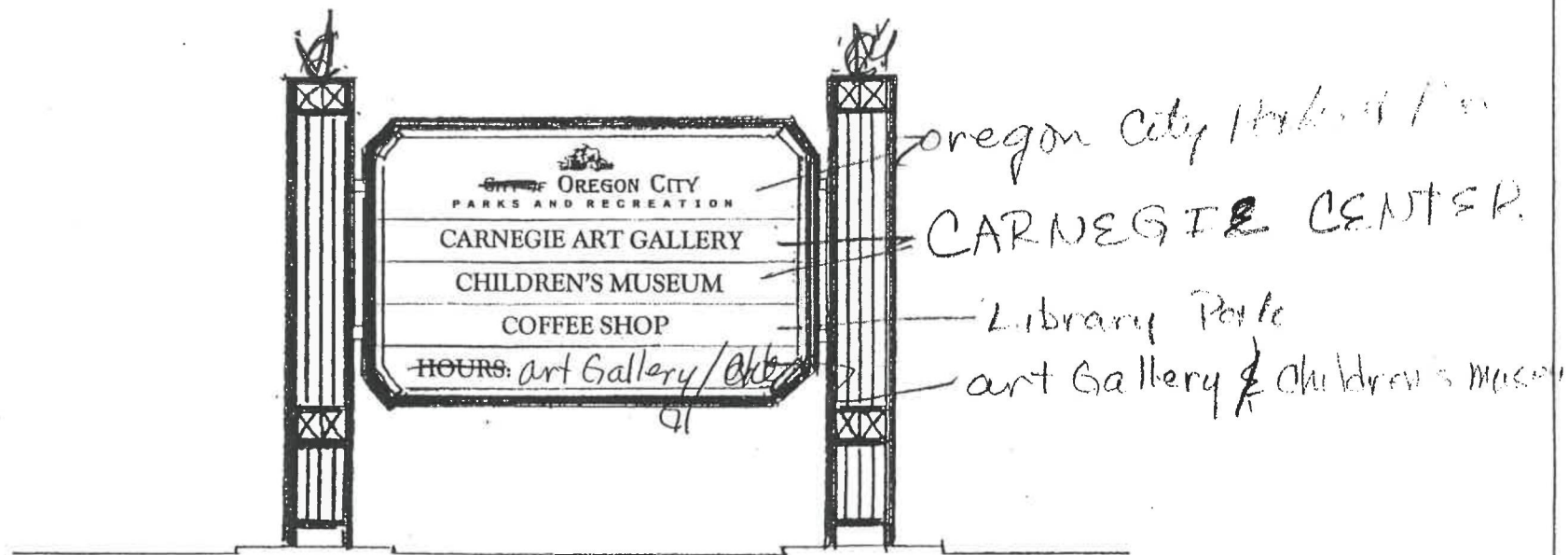

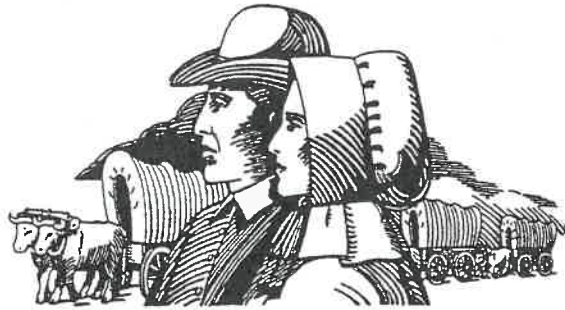

Month of: March 2002

Highlights of the past month:

Pioneer Center

- ◆ Facility use Seniors 1361; Community 803; Outreach 2594; Transportation 754; Volunteers 185
- ◆ Storage closet in dining room installed
- ◆ New programs started including feng-shui; Health Masters heart monitoring; Pinochle tournament

Aquatics

- ◆ The Columbia Basin Swim League Championships were held March 9-10. Including spectators, there were about 1,000 in attendance throughout the weekend.
- ◆ We have added an additional evening swimming instructor to accommodate the increased registrations.

Carnegie

- ◆ Attendance: Children's Museum 995, Gallery 1194
- ◆ Children's Museum closed January 26 – February 5 for downstairs door repairs exhibits rearrangements and update.
- ◆ Oregon's B-day celebration, February 14 –17, including "The Oregon Question" on Saturday, Feb 16, in partnership with McLoughlin House, Museum of the Oregon Territory and Atkinson Church.
- ◆ Spring Brochure finished and in mail. Summer is in planning stages.
- ◆ Spring classes are set, including colored pencil, beading and painting.
- ◆ Ermatinger House renovation meetings continue. Temporary roof installed on Ermatinger. No more leaks!
- ◆ Library Park landscaping to start this month. Sick trees were removed.
- ◆ Concerts in the Park and July 4 Celebration is scheduled.

Recreation

- ◆ Kids Day on February 15 and March 1: Total of 20 participants and was very successful.
- ◆ Go For the Gold parent and child class on March 15 has 4 parent/child groups registered.
- ◆ Two 3-week yoga classes started on March 6 with a total of 15 participants.
- ◆ 21st Century Grant Program spring schedule is complete.
- ◆ Planning for expanded summer program to include specialty camps for pre and early teens; Sports Week, Nature Week and Drama Week are all ideas in the works.
- ◆ Recruiting for summer staff

Cemetery

- ◆ Begin mowing and spot spraying
- ◆ Community Service filling holes in the Pioneer Section.

Parks

- ◆ Cleared portion of trail at Waterboard Park
- ◆ Low limbed and trimmed trees at Rivercrest
- ◆ Removed diseased trees from the Carnegie and Pioneer
- ◆ Picked up downed branches at Singer Creek Park
- ◆ Started mowing parks
- ◆ Moved rocks in Old Canemah parking lot
- ◆ Community Service at Clackamette RV Park

- ◆ Continue to put together purchase of Park Place property and Jessie Court park property
- ◆ Planning Commission approval of Chapin and Jessie Court park master plans
- ◆ Assume responsibility for management of the Library
- ◆ Represent Library at county meetings regarding budget and formula for funding
- ◆ Hillendale Park, bid process and bid opening
- ◆ Meet one-on-one with all permanent employees of the Library
- ◆ Defend Clackamas River Trail grant application before State Funding Panel
- ◆ Continue negotiations with Metro regarding Canemah Park property
