OREGON CITY PARKS & RECREATION Activity Report Program: Recreation/ Aquatics/ Carnegie

Month of: September, 2001

HIGHLIGHTS OF THE PAST MONTH:

Recreation/Aquatics/Carnegie

- Successfully completed the Concerts in the Park program at Rivercrest Park this year.
- Staff is still meeting with the school district to coordinate our involvement with the 21st Century Learning Centers program at four elementary schools and two middle schools.
- Our new automated external defibrillator (AED) is on-line at the swimming pool. The defibrillator is designed to treat sudden cardiac arrest victims by utilizing an electrical shock to restore an effective heart rhythm. The aquatics staff is now trained in its use.
- We completed extensive repairs to the swimming pool's filtration system during our twoweek maintenance closure.
- The summer day camp program was successfully completed. The program was much more cost effective this year than in year past.
- Actively planning for Grand Re-Opening of Carnegie Center
- Harvest Festival @ Ermatinger House successful
- Carnegie Art's League and OC Arts Commission joint booth at the Antique Fair.
- The Gatorade Punt, Pass and Kick competition will be held September 26th.

Pioneer Community Center

- Facility use for August: 1388 seniors; 609 Community use; 2531 Outreach; 1099 Transportation; 201 Volunteers
- Fund-Raising event held at Gillman Park Assisted Living raised \$1700 for the Meals-On-Wheels program
- Massage Therapy offered on the 2nd Friday of month is already booked through November

Subject: Signage on Park and Recreation Properties

Attached please find a copy of a Sign Permit Application for approval of a sign standard to be used by Oregon City Parks and Recreation, primarily at its non-park facilities: Pioneer Center, Carnegie Center, Pool, Ermatinger House, and perhaps the Cemetery.

Depending on the cost of constructing the signs, PRAC would also like to consider using this design at our parks. If used in the parks, sign materials might differ from those used at building sites due to the level of vandalism. (PRAC formally adopted this sign standard at their meet of September 17, 2001.)

Since we are looking at a concept, rather than a sign on a specific site, some of the questions on the Sign Permit Application are not applicable. At this point we don't even have exact locations determined so the details of construction, installation and illumination are unavailable. However, I would appreciate feed back on the design and recommendations on materials, especially from the HRB since most of the signs will be located in the Historic McLoughlin Neighborhood. The first signs would be placed at Library Park and the Carnegie Center. The park signs would be low and would be placed at the corners to replace the signs removed during construction. One tall sign would be placed closer to the building and would list the hours of operation and what entities are located in the building.

The signs are shown in two heights and you can get a general idea of the sign's dimension from the sketch of the person standing by each sign.

I am sorry to be so general in my comments. If you have suggestions of another way to approach this issue, please advise. Also, thank you for your willingness to waive the Application Fee on this project.
