Dear Ms. Craig.

I am interested in obtaining your permission to place a geocache on a path at Waterboard Park.

If you are not familiar with geocaching, it is a form of recreation where someone places a cache of small goodies outdoors in a public non-commercial location. The longitude and latitude and a description of the cache container are posted at this website: <u>http://www.geocaching.com</u>. The Oregonian recently printed a story about geocaching: It's posted online here: http://www.oregonlive.com/search/index.ssf?/base/living/104617815494540.xml

This is a family oriented form of recreation. People involved in it are asked to be discreet, pick up trash in the area, be careful not to damage wildlife habitat, etc. My plans are to put a small plastic box about 10 feet from the main paved path, behind some rocks, about ½ down the path between the viewpoint at Creed Street and the bottom of the path at South John Adams. The spot would not require anyone to trample vegetation to reach it.

I would also direct people to enjoy the view at Promontory Avenue and Creed Street and maybe tell them about the climbing crags described at this website:

http://ors.alpineclub.org/AAC/waterbd.html (that is, it your department approves of climbers using the park).

From my experience, this activity brings at most 2 or 3 visits in a day to the place where a geocache is hidden.

Please let me know if you are the right person to address my request. If I should need to ask permission of someone else, please tell me who that person is if you are aware of that would be.
